"Football is taking the lead in enhancing Government's Five Game Changers" - Sports Minister

"Football is taking the lead in enhancing Government's Five Game Changers, including feeding Sierra Leone, human capital development, and youth employment," says Minister of Sports Madam Augusta James-Teima.

She was speaking at the launch of the FIFA Football for Schools (F4S) program in Makeni on Wednesday.

The program aims at making the sport more accessible to boys and girls across Sierra Leone by including football activities into the country's school system.

"We as a government are looking forward to having more facilities, especially job opportunities for young people. Today, the specialist behind there will not only be teaching in the schools but probably come out in the afternoon to give extra trainings to our little kids because there is so much we have to do when we catch them young.

"This project will have a positive effect on Sierra Leone as well as the players. These kids will grow up to be physically, mentally, emotionally, economically, and socially developed. Therefore, it is very important that football is emphasised at school level where players are caught at a very young age and allowed to become lifelong players and understand everything about football, eventually sustaining the sport itself.

"Government is very much committed to the growth of Sports in line with other Ministries, and we are working assiduously in putting modalities in place to enhance the participation of football in this country because this sport has been a fundamental instrument in solving social problems facing society.

"Sport is life, it is expensive but if we put ourselves together, it will make Sierra Leone a developed nation. It is because the SLFA is sober, that is why we are getting all of these projects."

Madam James-Teima ended by promising to continue working with the Minister of Basic Education to train the kids for the future, saying they will make sure that what is given for sport in schools is being used for sport exclusively.

Sports Minister opens Mano River Union Karate Championship, reiterates government's continued support to sports

The Minister of Sports, Madam Augusta James-Teima, over the weekend launched the West Africa Commonwealth Karate Federation and the Mano River Union Championship at Bintumani International Conference Centre in Freetown.

Sierra Leone, Ghana, Guinea, Senegal, and Liberia all participated in the competition, with hosts Sierra Leone taking first position grabbing the highest gold medals, followed by Guinea and Liberia respectively.

Madam James-Teima was happy to witness such a laudable venture, which she described as 'very much noteworthy'. The Minister emphasised the essence of having such competition. "It is no mistake at all to host it in Sierra Leone," she pointed out.

She went on to say that: "As I sit here watching the strengths, kicks, and actions, I believe it would push physical, emotional, social, and economic development.

"Today, we are here to witness a very important stage in the development of Karate, and also form a Secretariat in the Mano River Union for Karate as well as making sure that the sport becomes something to rekon with in English speaking countries.

"I therefore, want to congratulate you [families of Karate] for making this venture a success. I also want to congratulate the Karate Association in Sierra Leone for taking the honours of hosting such a very important event.

"I commend the Executive Director of National Sports Authority [Dr. Kenneth Brima]. I always give him the support. We supervise them, and we've been working together to develop the game in Sierra Leone."

Minister of Sports, Madam Augusta
James-Teima, however, called on the
organisers to allow female Karatekas to also
demonstrate their skills in future events,
stressing that they should be working side
by side with the men. "We are living in a
world where gender parity is a must, and we
should be giving opportunities to women to
showcase their potential."

Sports Minister Updates Sierra Leoneans About Her Ministry's Activities

Minister of Sports, Augusta James-Teima, last Tuesday attended her inaugural public press conference since assuming office as Sierra Leone's first Female Minister of Sports.

The WEEKLY PRESS BRIEFING, organized by the Ministry of Information and Civic Education, took place at the Ministry of Foreign Affairs' Conference Hall, Tower Hill, Freetown.

When asked by the host, Imran Silla, about her plans for developing the Ministry, Minister James-Teima expressed gratitude for the opportunity and acknowledged President H.E Julius Maada Bio's confidence in her abilities.

She provided a comprehensive update on ongoing developmental projects aimed at bolstering the sports basket fund, benefiting associations aligned with national ranking standards. These initiatives would enable eligible associations to receive government funding.

In terms of infrastructure, Minister
James-Teima emphasized the Ministry's
commitment to modernizing facilities to
cater to various sports, with a focus on
renovating existing structures such as the
Siaka Stevens Stadium.

She commended the Sierra Leone Football Association (SLFA) for its contribution to constructing artificial turfs in several regions.

Furthermore, she outlined plans to conduct workshops and seminars in April 2024 to clarify the roles and responsibilities of the Ministry and National Sports Authority (NSA) staff in enhancing organizational structure and performance.

Madam Minister added that discussions with NSA authorities are underway to engage corporate entities, highlighting the mutual benefits of supporting sports as part of their corporate social responsibility.

Minister James-Teima stressed the importance of collective efforts from stakeholders, including the Ministry of Sports, NSA, National Olympic Committee (NOC), and SLFA, in realizing success in sports development.

She also urged active participation in initiatives such as the "Feed Salone" program, emphasizing the significance of self-sustainability within the sports community.

Addressing sports journalists, she emphasized collaboration and mutual support for advancing sports development in the country.

She expressed gratitude to the Ministry of Information and Civic Education for the invitation, reaffirming her commitment to partnership in national development.

All-Africa Games: Sierra Leone Participates in African Union Sports Council Meeting

The African Union Sports Council Special Technical Committee Meeting on Youth, Culture, and Sports convened on March 9th, 2024, at the Movenpick Ambassador Hotel in Accra, Ghana. The meeting saw the attendance of key figures including Mr. Joseph Techman Kany, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Sports, and Steven Keifala, Director of Participation and Sustainable Sports, NSA.

The primary focus of the meeting centered on deliberation on the presentation from the African Union Sport Council Advisory Board. The Board proposed Egypt as the country that meets the standard to host the 14th Edition of the Africa Games in 2027, following the withdrawal of DR Congo's bid. Additionally, discussions revolved around the preparation for the African Games 2027 and beyond, encompassing its roadmap for future events.

In a significant development, Sierra Leone participants seconded the motion on Ghana's initiative to designate Accra as the African Sport City for the period spanning 2024 to 2027, and this was unanimously endorsed by the sport experts during the meeting.

Subsequently, the Ministers of Sports from the participating African countries convened in the afternoon to review and approve the various recommendations put forward by the Special Technical Committee. Egypt emerged as the chosen host for the 2027 African Games, while Accra was officially designated as the Sport City for 2024.

It was agreed as part of the recommendation that guidelines should be developed to ensure African countries that host the African Games are automatically declared the City of African Sports after hosting. This recommendation came as an acknowledgement and encouragement for the huge investment undertaken to host the African Games.

Government Officials, Business Owners & Car Dealers Hold Follow-Up Meeting

On Tuesday, April 30, 2024, a follow-up meeting was held at the Ministry of Sports conference hall to discuss the relocation of businesses around the Brookfields stadium area in Freetown.

The meeting was attended by representatives from the National Sports Authority (NSA), along with car dealers and private business owners operating near the stadium car park and bus halt.

The aim of the meeting was to set a deadline for these businesses to leave the area due to ongoing stadium rehabilitation work.

The Vice Chairman of the car dealers, Mohamed G Jabbie, and Madam Adiatulai Jalloh, representing the private business owners, expressed their willingness to cooperate but requested assistance in relocating to other areas within the city. They also highlighted that they had invested significant funds in the existing structures.

Joseph T. Kany, Permanent Secretary of the Ministry of Sports, representing the Minister, asked the business owners to submit all documents related to their tenancy by Thursday, May 2, 2024.

Kany stated that the Ministry would conduct a site visit to assess the situation first-hand

and would also coordinate with the Freetown City Council and the Ministry of Youths to understand the businesses' operations and arrangements in the affected areas.

The PS advised the business owners to start exploring alternative locations within Freetown while the Ministry investigates. He assured them that a final decision would be communicated in a follow-up meeting after the investigation.

It is expected that the Chinese technical team will complete the stadium rehabilitation and hand over the facility to the government by November 2024.
